1. Fibre

Fibres are taken from natural materials



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2. Yarn

The SPINNING procedure turns FIBRES into YARN

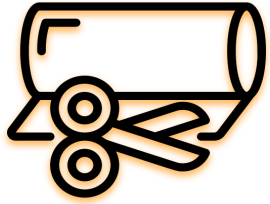


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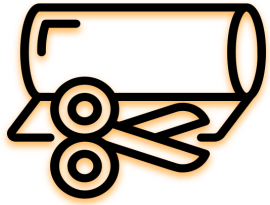
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3. Fabric

Yarns are WOVEN or KNITTED into fabric





4. Coloured Fabric

White fabric is DYED into different colours

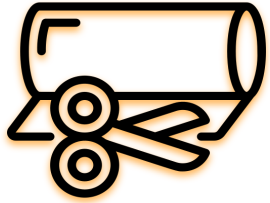


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5. Clothes

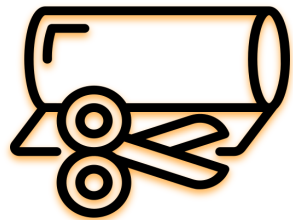
Coloured fabric are CUT and SEWN into clothing items



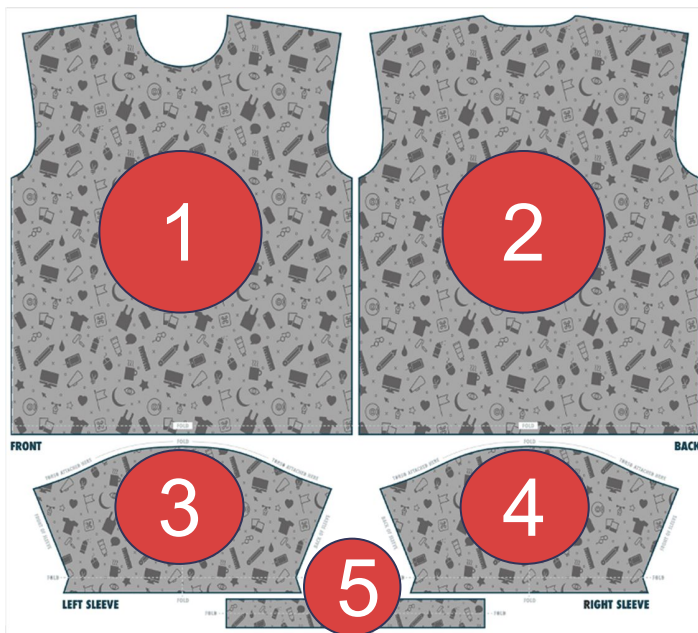


HOW MANY PIECES of fabric is needed to make this T-Shirt?



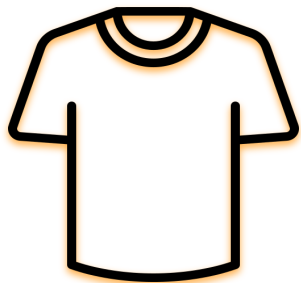

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6. Clothes Details

Finished clothes are boxed and SHIPPED around the world

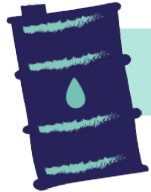




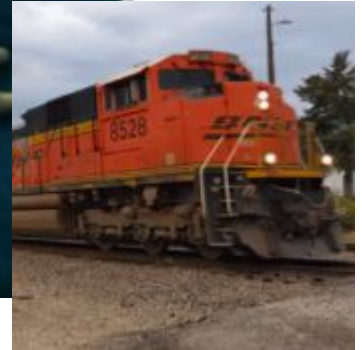
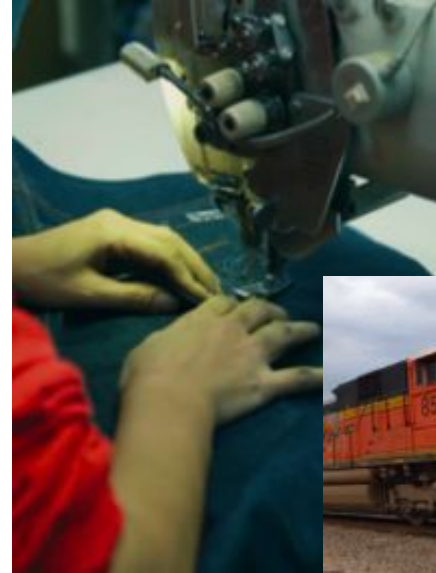
